# AFA Lance P. Sijan Chapter Meeting Minutes – May 12, 2015

#### Welcome

## **President's Comments (Don Kidd)**

#### **Cyber Patriot Program**

Planning for the 2016 Cyber Patriot Competition is underway. Expectations are for more schools to participate.

#### General Bernard A. Schriever Memorial Essay Contest

Roy Griggs and Dave Shiller are leading the planning activities for the second, annual General Bernard A. Schriever Memorial essay contest. Roy and Dave have been working with the Air Force Space Command (AFSPC) Historian Office to develop this year's topic. The theme for this year's Gen Bernard A. Schriever Memorial Essay Contest is:

How does Air Force Space Command best develop space and cyber Airmen to "win tomorrow's fight"? Specifically, how does the Air Force change recruitment, initial qualification, advanced training, and career development to build the space and cyber leaders who are prepared to excel in space and cyber domains that are increasingly contested, congested, and competitive? In addition, how does the command gracefully transition from our current force-development system to one that better prepares AFSPC for the future?

Papers need to be submitted by July 31, 2105. Entries must conform to all guidelines found in AU-1, *Air University Style and Author Guide*, are **limited to 3,500 words** (excluding endnotes and graphics), and must be double spaced. Essays must be original, unpublished, and not currently under consideration for other publications. Essays may have no more than two authors. The *Air and Space Power Journal* will hold the right to publish winning entries. In addition, the Lance P. Sijan Chapter of the Air Force Association will sponsor awards for the three best essays. Trophies will be presented along with cash rewards. The winning entrant will receive \$1,000, the second place winner will receive \$750, and the third place winner will receive \$500.

#### Combined Federal Campaign (CFC)

The Chapter's CFC application to be listed as a charitable organization was approved. Former Sijan President Dave Shiller submitted an application for the Sijan Chapter to be listed as a charitable organization to receive CFC contributions. Individuals making CFC contributions can allocate a portion or

all of their donations to our Chapter. The Chapter now needs to get the word out to the Wings and Air Force Bases about our new status.
