Attendees had the opportunity to spend time with new elected Chairman of the Board, Gerald Murray, who discussed the AFA mission and his vision for our organization. Chairman Murray thanked all for their unwavering leadership and support for AFA in carrying out the mission. During the course of events, he made a concentrated effort to make the rounds and try to become acquainted with everyone, to hear their stories, and understand the challenges and accomplishments of the various regions and states. ### **The Fourth Annual Run to Remember 5K**

For the past four years, the Arnold Air Society Danielson Squadron at Colorado State University has held a 5K in honor of Second Lieutenant Benjamin Walder, who took his own life shortly after entering active duty. All proceeds are donated to the Larimer County Alliance for Suicide Prevention, to raise awareness about suicide, especially within the military. This year, the race will be held on 26 April on Colorado State's campus.

Lieutenant Walder was a respected Air Force ROTC cadet, member of Arnold Air Society, and Colorado State University alumni. He took his own life after commissioning and becoming a Second Lieutenant. The Danielson Squadron feels it is very important to carry on his legacy for his family, friends, and those who have been impacted by suicide. On the fourth anniversary of the Run to Remember, our squadron hopes to boost our registration numbers. This year the race has been made a qualifier for the BOLDER Boulder 10K, which will be held on 25 May. We are looking forward to seeing runners from across the state participate in the event, and encourage all to register in support of a great cause.

This past year, we raised over \$2000 for the Alliance for Suicide Prevention. We hope to exceed that amount this year, and continue to grow this event in Lieutenant Walder's honor. Registration for the Run to Remember can be found on Active.com. A T-shirt is included with the registration fee, and military discounts are offered. ## **Lance P. Sijan in Action**

### **Sijan Chapter Sponsors 78<sup>th</sup> Pearl Harbor Anniversary Ceremony**

Annually the Sijan Chapter joins with other local organization to sponsor the remembrance ceremony for Pearl Harbor. In the December 7, 1941 attack, 353 Japanese aircraft conducted the attack in two waves launched from six enemy aircraft carriers over a period of 90 minutes. 2459 individuals were killed in action and 1809 were wounded. 22 US ships and 347 US aircraft were out of action because of the attack, constituting 40% of the Pacific Fleet. War was declared by the United States on December 8, 1941.

At the December 6th ceremony at the Pioneer Museum in Colorado Springs, several local heroes from the Japanese attack were recognized, "including Petty Officer 1<sup>st</sup> Class Daniel T. Griffin, a Colorado Springs resident who is believed to be the first American casualty of World War II. Leaders also paid homage to Lt Jim Downing, who was ashore when the Japanese planes struck the unprepared American Pacific Fleet. After making his way to the stricken USS West Virginia, Downing sprayed seawater on ammunition stored on the deck to prevent more explosions. Downing, who was the second-oldest survivor of the attacks, died last year at 104 years." (Excerpt from The Gazette, Dec 7, 2019)

Donald Stratton, 97, one of the last USS Arizona survivors in the Pikes Peak region, lives in Colorado Springs, but was unable to attend as he was recovering from pneumonia. 1177 crew members died in the Pearl Harbor bombing and sinking of the Arizona. Stratton suffered burns across more than 60% of his body, a cruel statistic shared by most of the 355 surviving Arizona crew members.

City Councilmember Andres Pico was guest speaker, the Proclamation reading and remarks were provided by Mr. Pico and Stan VanderWerf, El Paso County Commissioner, and the wreath laying was solemnly performed by the Joint Color Guard NORAD and US Northern Command.

## In Remembrance

**AFA Members:** We sadly report the loss of Tiffany Haley, Sijan Chapter Teacher of the Year and Colorado State Teacher of the Year. The following letter was sent to Dave Geuting, Chapter VP for Aerospace Education.

October 16, 2019;

Dear Colonel Geuting,

I cannot express the pride we felt in receiving your fabulous package yesterday containing Tiffany Haley's State Teacher of the Year certificate, jacket, pin, book and check. She was such a phenomenal teacher with a passion for space science, and loved her many connections with the space community. She would not have missed this State Banquet for anything in the world.

It is with the greatest sadness a parent should ever have to face that we must share with you that Tiffany has passed away. She was in a doctor's office having a routine procedure with a common light anesthetic when her heart stopped. Although CPR restarted her heart in 81 seconds, she never regained consciousness, was in a coma for 17 days, and died on August 8, 2019. Her memorial service was held on August 24th.

Tiffany was extremely honored to have been recognized at the local level and was so very excited to attend the state banquet and program. Unfortunately, we have never been able to open Tiffany's Apple computer or cell phone, nor could the Apple professionals. (She once told me liked to use Greek passwords!) I know there are people and events we wish we could have notified ahead of time, but instead must wait to be contacted by people such as yourself. There was such an outpouring of grief in the community that a GoFundMe scholarship fund was started in her memory. It has around \$5,000 in it to date, and will be awarded to an Air Academy High School graduating senior pursuing a science degree next spring. We will be adding your check to this scholarship fund. Thank you so much for recognizing what an exceptional young woman Tiffany Haley was. With much respect, gratitude and sadness, Nancy and Tim Haley

## Disabled Veterans Eligible for free National Park Service Lifetime Access Pass



Many Veterans, with a service connected disability rating, are entering Federal recreation lands and national parks for free with an America the Beautiful-the National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands lifetime Access Pass through an interagency partnership between the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service, Forest Service, Fish and Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management, Army Corps of Engineers and Bureau of Reclamation. Good for entry into thousands of federally managed recreation sites across the country, the Lifetime Access Pass is another way a grateful nation says thank you for the service and sacrifices of U. S. Veterans with disabilities.

The Access Pass admits the pass owner and any passengers in a single, private vehicle (non-commercial) at per-vehicle entrance and day use fee areas; or, the pass owner plus three additional adults where per-person fees are charged. In addition to free entry at participating sites, the Access Pass includes discounts on some expanded amenity fees such as camping. Sites recommend that pass owners check with each site before visiting for details about Access Pass entry and discounts.

Veterans who have been medically determined to have a disability are eligible for the Lifetime Access Pass — with three options for obtaining the pass: First, Veterans with disability documentation can order the Access Pass online for a \$10 processing fee which includes standard shipping. Documentation required includes:

- Proof of residency
- VA disability award letter, VA summary of benefits, or proof of SSDI income

Second, the Interagency Access Pass may be obtained through the mail. Download a paper application from <https://store.usgs.gov/access-pass>. Follow the instructions on the website and pay the document processing fee of \$10. Once the application package is received by USGS, the documentation will be verified and a pass imprinted with the pass owner's name will be mailed to the applicant. Passes ordered online or through the mail will be delivered 3 to 4 weeks after receipt of documentation and processing payment.

A third option is for disabled Veterans to visit a participating federal recreation site where interagency passes are issued, present photo identification (e.g., Driver's license, State ID, birth certificate, Passport, or permanent resident card), provide documentation of permanent disability, or read and sign a Statement of Permanent Disability affidavit. That's It. The Pass is free and issued at the time of entry.

Make sure to have photo ID available when using your Lifetime Access Pass and enjoy the majestic scenery and abundant recreational opportunities our National Parks provide. For additional questions regarding the pass, please check out the Frequently Asked Questions.
