

K9 Veterans Day 2022

March 13, 2022 is National K9 Veterans Day. The day is set aside to honor and commemorate the service and sacrifices of American military working dogs throughout history. One of the top ways to honor K9 Veterans is to visit a War Dog Memorial. Did you know that we have a War Dog Memorial in downtown Colorado Springs? It is at Memorial Park, located beside the other Military memorials on the West side of the park. It was dedicated on September 12, 2020.

March 13, 1942 was the date that the US Army began training for its new War Dog program, named the "K-9 Corps." Thus began the long and distinguished history of US Military Working Dogs. Thousands of War Dogs have served valiantly through the years. An example of their service is the Navy SEAL working dog Cairo, was part of the Bin Laden raid.


Sijan Member Spotlight Kimberly Mueller, VP of Member Relations





Lance P. Sijan Chapter and Colorado State Garcia Scholarship

Do you know a student who could use a scholarship? If so, you're in luck! There are *TWO* AFA scholarships available- one at the chapter level and one at the state level.

The Lance P. Sijan chapter scholarship is available to high school senior or college freshman, sophomore, or junior. The Lance P. Sijan Chapter awards scholarships annually to outstanding high school seniors who have been accepted for enrollment at a college or university, and to current outstanding college freshman, sophomore, and junior students. Scholarships are open to immediate family members (son, daughter, spouse) of active duty and retired Air and Space Force, Air Force Reserve, and Air National Guard members in Colorado Springs; AFJROTC cadets; college freshmen, sophomores, and juniors from the greater Colorado Springs area attending any college or university; Silver Wings members; and Arnold Air Society members.

The Francisco Garcia Scholarship is awarded by the Colorado State Air Force Association (CSAFA). It is awarded annually to one recipient in the State of Colorado. The applicant must be a graduating senior from a Colorado high school and intend to obtain a college degree in an STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) related field.

Applications for both scholarships are due by 30 April 2022.

A LOOK BACK

American Women Aviators in World War II

In light of March being Women's History Month, it's quite appropriate to highlight the enormous contribution made by American female aviators during World War II (WWII). These heroic individuals overcame significant cultural, organizational, and political resistance to serve their country in wartime and in the process laid the foundation for future women pilots in the U.S. Air Force to fly virtually every airframe in the service.

Confronted with the lack of male pilots on the home front in the early 1940s, the U.S. Army Air Force (USAAF) eventually agreed to allow female flyers to perform a variety of essential missions in the CONUS to support the U.S. war effort.

In September 1942, USAAF created the Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron under Air Transport Command to fly aircraft from manufacturing plants to air

bases and debarkation ports in the U.S. The service recruited more than two dozen experienced, licensed female pilots with over 500 flying hours to perform these missions.

USAAF also established the Women's Flying Training Detachment in the fall of 1942 initially at Houston, Texas, then moved the program to Avenger Field in Sweetwater, Texas. Applicants needed 200 hours of flight time in order to qualify for the 30-week training program that emphasized cross country flying.

In August 1943, USAAF consolidated these two activities into the Women Air Force Service Pilots (WASP) program at Avenger Field under the leadership of famous aviator Jacqueline Cochran. More than 20,000 women applied for the program with 1.830 being accepted and 1,074 graduated from the arduous training program.

Female graduates of these USAAF programs operated from 120 bases across the U.S. and performed a wide variety of missions that included ferrying nearly 13,000 aircraft over 60,000 miles in the U.S., towing targets in live fire exercises, performing maintenance test flights, training other pilots, transporting cargo, and testing new aircraft. They flew virtually every type of aircraft in the WWII inventory – i.e., trainer, fighter, bomber, and reconnaissance. transport, These included the hard to handle P-47 Thunderbolt, B-26 Marauder, and B-29 Superfortress. A few highly qualified WASP graduates flew rocket-and jet-propelled aircraft such as the experimental Bell YP-59A jet fighter.

A LOOK BACK

Thirty-eight of these gallant female aviators lost their lives while serving their country, flying in good weather and bad, during daytime and at night.

WASP aviators were essentially civilian employees of the USAAF. During 1944, Congress considered bills to incorporate WASP into the USAAF that were supported by the War Department, General H. H. Arnold, and President Roosevelt. However, this effort met with strong political and media opposition that claimed the program had squandered taxpayer money and that it was a wasted effort since women aviators would not be flying these missions after the war. There also was concern that they would compete with men for limited post-war flying opportunities. Ultimately, due to political pressure and the increasing availability of male pilots to perform CONUS missions, the USAAF disbanded WASP in December 1944.

Speaking to the last WASP graduating class in late 1944, General Arnold paid tribute to them in stating "You have shown that you can fly wingtip to wingtip with your brothers. If ever there was a doubt in anyone's mind that women could become skilled pilots, the WASP dispelled that doubt. I want to stress how valuable the whole WASP program has been for the country."



continue to give so much in service to this nation."

Check out the following books if you would like to learn more about WASP: Winning My Wings: A Woman Airforce Service Pilot in World War II, Flying Higher: The Women Airforce Service Pilots of World War II, and WA Sadly, the contribution of women aviators in WWII was ignored for decades thereafter until President Jimmy Carter signed a bill in 1977 granting WWII veteran status to WASP, which began to shed light on their contributions. More significantly, on July 1, 2009, Congress awarded WASP aviators the Congressional Gold Medal, the highest civilian honor possible. On March 11, 2010, President Obama presented the medal to a representative group of WASP and praised these patriotic individuals who "courageously answered their country's call in a time of need while blazing a trail for the brave women who have given and


By a strange twist of fate, I was selected to attend the U.S. Naval War College as a student in the Senior Course of study there as an Air Force Lieutenant Colonel. He was the inaugural President of the newly formed AFA Chapter 180 – the Newport Blue & Gold Chapter at the U.S. Naval War College, and I was his inaugural Chapter Secretary. We started the Chapter back in 1998 and it is still in existence with annual members of the Air Force students attending both the Senior and Mid-Grade course of study at the War College. AFA members who were instructors led the Chapter and kept it going after each graduating class departed.

'Buck' was an inspiration to both the Air Force students at the War College and especially to me. He took me under his wing and was my mentor. After I graduation from the War College in 1998, I kept up with 'Buck' and we



exchanged Christmas cards for many years and shared drinks at several AFA National Conventions, bringing each other up to date on our careers. 'Buck's' leadership at the AFA National level saw him executing the first full season of CyberPatriot, a cyber defense competition meant to interest students in STEM. He also helped found StellarXplorers, the AFA sponsored model rocketry education and competition program.

'Buck' later went on to be the AFA National Director from 2004-2007. In the course of his varied careers, 'Buck' won numerous honors for his leadership over many years. He was truly an inspiration to all of us both in AFA and the U.S. Air Force and also to the young people participating in his CyberPatriot and StellarXplorers programs. I am proud to call him a friend and for him to have called me his friend. He will truly be missed! Our condolences go out to his family and friends.

2022 Scholarship Application

The Lance P. Sijan Chapter awards scholarships annually to outstanding high school seniors who have been accepted for enrollment at a college or university, and to current outstanding college freshman, sophomore, and junior students. High School applicants must be seniors/graduates who plan to attend college during the 2022-23 academic year. Scholarships are open to immediate family members (son, daughter, spouse) of active duty and retired Air and Space Force, Air Force Reserve, and Air National Guard members in Colorado Springs; AFJROTC cadets; college freshmen, sophomores, and juniors from the greater Colorado Springs area attending any college or university; Silver Wings members; and Arnold Air Society members. High School students selected for full scholarships that will be awarded in 2022 or have been selected to attend a Military Service Academy are not eligible.

Scholarships are awarded based on the character and leadership potential of the student, which includes academic achievement, demonstrated leadership, community service, and writing composition. A Scholarship Selection Committee comprised of military and aerospace industry leaders will select the scholarship recipients. The scholarship selection process is nondiscriminatory. Scholarship Committee members' immediate family members are not eligible for a scholarship award nor can they benefit financially in any way from this program. There is no specified restriction on the use of scholarship award moneys; however, it is the intent of the Sijan Chapter that they be used in the direct support of academic pursuits.

Complete application packages must include the following (only complete packages will be considered):

- Application form below (completely filled out)
- A high school or college transcript
- A copy of SAT and/or ACT scores (high school seniors only)
- At least one letter of recommendation from a current or past teacher. (Up to three letters of recommendation may be included with the application. This is optional for spouses.)
- An essay of no fewer than 500 words and no more than 1,000 words that answers and justifies the following question:

What do you believe should be the role of the United States military (Active, Reserve, National Guard) in response Russia's invasion of Ukraine?

Scholarship Process and Selection Criteria

Scholarship Information

The Francisco Garcia Scholarship is a scholarship awarded by the Colorado State Air Force Association (CSAFA). It is a \$1000 scholarship awarded annually to one recipient in the State of Colorado. The scholarship process and selection criteria are outlined below.

Scholarship Process

- Each Colorado AFA chapter is responsible for selecting one applicant from their chapter who will compete at the state-level for final selection of the scholarship
- Chapters must submit their applicant's complete applications to the CSAFA President/Aerospace Education Vice President by April 30 of each calendar year.
- The CSAFA President/Aerospace Education Vice President reserves the right to challenge eligibility should they feel a student does not meet the criteria set forth in this policy.
- Scholarship awards will be made on a nondiscriminatory basis.
- The state-level scholarship selection committee will be made up of equal representation from each Colorado AFA chapter in order to ensure impartial selection.
- Per the original scholarship guidelines, a maximum of \$4000 will be administered by the CSAFA each year. Currently the CSAFA will award a maximum of \$1000 in order to maintain and recoup the principal of the scholarship's endowment.

Scholarship Selection Criteria

- 1. The applicant must be a graduating senior from a Colorado high school and intend to obtain a college degree in a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) related field. Examples of a "STEM related field" include the following degrees:
 - Mathematics
 - Engineering (civil, electrical, mechanical, software, systems)
 - Physics
 - Information Technology
 - Chemistry
 - Astrodynamics
 - Astrophysics
- 2. Returning college students may apply for subsequent years until they graduate.
- 3. Applicant's financial need is the first priority, community service and grade point average follow sequentially in priority when selecting a candidate.
- 4. Scholarship funds are to be used for tuition, room and board, textbooks, gas, computers, or lab fees. They are not to be used for personal expenses such as food and beverages.
- 5. High school transcripts and proof of acceptance to a college must be supplied with the student's application. The candidate must be accepted to a college or university prior to being considered for the scholarship.
