Air and Space Forces Association National Convention

As the AFA delegates streamed into the Gaylord Resort, National Harbor, Maryland for the 2022 National Convention, it was a time to meet and greet, network and renew long time friendships. After credentialing the delegate rosters (15 attended of 21 allotted from the Rocky Mountain Region) by the AFA Staff, attendees could choose which of four workshops to attend: Membership-Best Practices from the Field and New Opportunities; How AFA Best Supports our Air and Space Forces-AFA Advocacy Information You Can Use; Making AFA Relevant in our Communities; AFA Field Leadership-Investing in Ourselves and Growing the Future. Also the IT Staff was on standby to solve any and all problems at Chapter and State levels. Our Region delegates spread out to gather information from all areas to take back home to help local Chapters.

Saturday afternoon was the first of two days of business sessions and our elected board members efficiently went through the required formalities for a session with Welcoming Remarks from Chairman Gerald Murray, Credential Committee Report, Approval of Convention Rules and Procedures, Board Actions and Constitution Changes, followed by further remarks from Chairman Murray and President Bruce "Orville" Wright. The National elections were uncontested so following votes from the floor the following individuals became National Officers:

The primary discussion item was the Governance update, which was tabled from last year's convention in order to further refine the proposal and to work through some highly controversial areas. Mike Liquori and Molly Mae Potter led the discussion and fielded questions from the floor, noting that the proposed bylaws had been drafted by the Governance and Bylaws Committee with the goal of producing a set of bylaws which allows for growth and strength in the Association for another 75 years and beyond. The recommendations set forth by the committee were evaluated, discussed, and reviewed by field leaders, board members, former Chairmen, staff, and the legal team. Some of these updates included: Maintaining but modernizing our delegate structure; Clearly defining classes of membership and voting privileges; Updating the title of President to President and Chief Executive Officer; Including and defining a skills matrix guidance for candidate selection by the Nomination and Governance Committee; Clearly defining the purpose of the convention as well as the delegate selection; Allowing for electronic voting to be implemented for elections and other matters requiring voting;

Setting the number of voting board members from 11 to 21; Defining the minimum standing committees and councils needed to run the organization, leaving the opportunity to add or dissolve committees in the future. At the business session on Sunday, the proposed By-Laws passed with a majority vote.

There will need to be a transition of execution before full institutionalization and realization of the bylaws into our current operations. To address this transitory time, the committee will have a proviso document accompanying the bylaws that will outline transition timelines as it relates to specific aspects of change management. The committee will remain in existence and will continue to work building out a complimentary governance manual. This governance manual will include the Articles of Incorporation, the newly established bylaws, and an operations manual to include updated committee and council charters, processes and procedure updates to compliment and support the bylaws, as well as any additional operational support documents needed to effectively and efficiently run our Association. Following the Governance discussion, Len Vernamonti presented a moving tribute on the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War, many veterans of which were in attendance as AFA members. Chairman Murray closed Saturday's session with a reminder of the Annual Awards Banquet, which was scheduled for the evening.

The Awards Banquet at the Air and Space Forces Association annual convention might well have been called the Colorado Mel Harmon Chapter show. Many exceptional chapters across the continent and overseas were recognized, but Mike Sumida, Mel Harmon Chapter President, made so many trips up to the stage that it became evident which Chapter had had an extraordinary year. One year ago the Mel Harmon Chapter was the Outstanding Small Chapter of the Year, an accomplishment which the Chapter repeated again for 2022—however, it didn't stop there. Mel Harmon was also recognized for the Donald W. Steele Sr., Memorial Award for "Unit of the Year," AFA's highest unit award. A single such award is made to the AFA chapter which has distinguished itself in all fields of the AFA mission, new member procurement, community relations, aerospace education, overall programming, best single program, and communications over and above the service for which Exceptional Service Awards (Unit) and Outstanding Chapter Awards are presented for such service. Direct nominations are not accepted for this award, the Awards Committee selects the recipient from among units selected as the outstanding chapter in their respective size categories. Congratulations to all the members of the Mel Harmon Chapter for exceptional service and two great years of recognition by the National Awards Board.

Saturday evening closed with Regional caucuses, one being held for Rocky Mountain Region to elect a new Region President to follow Linda Aldrich's end of three-year term. Our new Region President is Fran Bradshaw from Utah, a long-time member of Utah AFA, former Chapter and State President. Fran is completely familiar with all thing AFA and will easily step into to fill Linda's shoes for the Region. Congratulations Fran on your new position in AFA!

The Sunday Business session covered a host of topics including a summary of the Legends tour, one segment of which included USAFA, Buckley, Peterson and Schriever Space Force Bases. General Officers with a wealth of history and experience to share provided panel discussions and conducted multiple question and answer sessions with active duty and civilian personnel during the tours. In our area, Stephen Gourley (Mile High Chapter) and Linda Aldrich (Sijan Chapter) were the accompanying members to ensure a smooth execution of the tour in our area. The Aerospace Education update from National Officer Stephen Gourley covered the success and lessons learned for Stellar Xplorers, CyberPatriot, scholarships, grants and other related AE topics. The attendees were able to meet the National Teacher of the Year, Nancy Parra-Quinian, King Junior High School, Mesa Arizona followed by a visit from all the Arnold Air Society and Silver Wings members who were attending sessions for the weekend. Vice Chairman, Field Operations, Jim Simons provided an AFA Field update with Chapter Best Practices to help all Chapters learn from what has been successful in the Field.

Departing Region Presidents, to include Linda Aldrich, were recognized and thanked for their long-time devotion to AFA. After a financial update, attendees were off to services at the Washington National Cathedral

The service entitled Honoring Our Heritage, Standing on the shoulders of Giants Yesterday and Today, was graced with participation by the United States Air Force Band, remarks from AF Chief of Chaplains Maj Gen Randall Kitchens, and greetings from AF Chief of Staff Gen Charles Brown, Jr., Chief of Space Operations Gen John "Jay" Raymond, and The Honorable Frank Kendall, Secretary of the Air Force. The service of worship with sacred readings was presented in English, Hebrew, Arabic and Greek. Chaplain Maj Gen William Dendinger offered the Words of Address regarding our heritage and observance concluded with prayers and the Air Force Hymn.

The AFA National Convention was jam-packed with information, events, awards, ceremonies and a host of materials provided to take back to the Chapters for use in the field for the mission of AFA. Any AFA member who was able to attend benefited in multiple ways and will bring home more skills to share with other members. Thank you to the amazing AFA National Staff for the incredible organization that brought this event together with such success



They were so entertaining that we're not sure if our guests really wanted to interrupt them to start the actual program for the evening! And all this was taking place from the top level convention room of Weidner Field, the Switchbacks soccer field in

Colorado Springs, providing a glorious view of the front range as the sun was setting.



Caty was extremely witty as our emcee, bad jokes included, and kept the evening moving at a fun and efficient pace. Arnold Air Society and Silver Wings are national sister organizations, working together to develop future leaders through community service, professional development and education about our national defense. These are nation-wide organizations and all the members are also



members of the Air and Space Forces Association. Cadet Lauren Weber is a rising senior at Colorado State University studying civil engineering. While at CSU, she has been an inspiring leader within the AFROTC program at Detachment 90 and within AAS at the Mark Giles Danielson Squadron. Vice Chairman of the Board for Aerospace Education, Stephen Gourley, announced that our 2021 State Teacher of the Year, **Mr. Robbie Ferguson**, was recognized in the National Teacher of the Year (ToY) competition. The National Teacher of the Year award is presented to a dedicated K-12 educator and AFA State Teacher of the Year winner. This honor recognizes Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) educators for their outstanding classroom performance, collaborative initiatives, educational outreach, leadership, and significant impact in the school and community. To be eligible the candidate must be submitted by their respective AFA State leaders. The candidate must be a former AFA State Teacher of the Year selected during the most recent past two years. When we spent time with Robbie Ferguson last year we knew we had met someone absolutely extraordinary. This year we submitted Robbie to compete against AFA State Teachers of the Year from across the National and overseas chapters. In this unbelievably tough competition with nominees who have devoted their careers to STEM education, we are so proud to announce Robbie as the Second Place Winner for the Air & Space Forces Association/Rolls-Royce National/STEM Teacher of the Year. Robbie was presented with a certificate and a \$2000 check in honor of his accomplishments.

Robbie then jointed Stephen to recognize our 2022 Chapter Teachers of the Year. As an independent, non-profit, education organization promoting public understanding of aerospace power and the pivotal role it plays in the security of the nation, the AFA mission includes the promotion of teaching Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) in K-12 classrooms throughout the country. Each Chapter may select a Chapter Teacher of the Year and recognize all they contribute to encouraging students in the STEM programs. Each of our Chapter ToYs received a Certificate of Excellence, a check for \$250, an AFA Padfolio and a Chapter Teacher of the Year pin, plus a very special gift - a book of Medal of Honor recipients' quotes

and each one was personally autographed by Medal of Honor recipient Drew Dix. Congratulations to these amazing educators.

Mel Harmon Chapter ToY: **Ms. Sharon Kok-Pollock**, Pueblo Academy of Arts, Pueblo. Sharon is a Math Teacher for sixth, seventh and eighth graders and was the force behind establishing a MathCounts team for annual competitions and providing the opportunity for students to show their skills at a higher level.

Mile High Chapter ToY: **Mr. R. Al Godman,** Legacy High School, Broomfield. Al is an 18-year Aeronautics instructor and developed a class that went from an overview of aviation opportunities to hands-on participation in skills and knowledge for students to become private pilots. He obtained flight simulators and accompanying software to provision an entire high school computer lab.

Robert E. Huyser Chapter ToY: **Ms. Katharine Smushkov,** Dual Emersion Academy, Grand Junction. With the challenge of bringing science into the lives of first graders, she has "signed on" with the Space Foundation to serve as an International Liaison, a role giving her new tools to forward the connection between operations in the space world and STEM education.

Lance P. Sijan Chapter ToY (Two educators this year): **Ms. Valerie DeLello** of Bear Creek Elementary, Colorado Springs. Valerie signed up all her sixth-grade classes with NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory to help kids learn more about how the Mars rover works by having students design their own rovers.

Mr. Bryce McLean, Coronado High School, Colorado Springs. His principal gave him full credit for building the engineering program and for starting the Robotics Team

The State AFA may also recognize a State Teacher of the Year who receives a check for \$500, a Certificate of Excellence, a personalized jacket and a State Teacher of the Year pin. We are proud to announce our State Teacher of the Year is **Mr. Bryce McLain**. As a master teacher for the Project Lead the Way aerospace course, Mr. McLain has had the opportunity to travel the country educating other while expanding his own teaching skill and techniques. As coach of Cougars Gone Wired, Coronado's First Robotics team, shared that his students "will amaze you with their abilities and their drive and curiosity." The program has allowed students to gain post-secondary workforce readiness skills and build leadership and teamwork. Congratulations to Bryce McLean, and we appreciate all you have done and will continue to do for our students in the arena of STEM education.



AFA Changes Name to the Air & Space Forces Association

After 76 years, the Air Force Association is changing its name to the Air & Space Forces Association to better match its mission supporting and advocating for both Airmen and Guardians.

AFA was incorporated on Feb. 4, 1946—more than a year before the Air Force broke away from the Army and became an independent service under the National Security Act of 1947. The <u>Space Force was established</u> on Dec. 20, 2019, creating a new military service for the first time in more than seven decades, and marking one of the most significant changes in the history of the Air Force.

"Today, both military services are represented by the Department of the Air Force, and thus, both are fully represented by our Association," said AFA Chairman Gerald Murray, former Chief Master Sergeant of the Air Force. "This change makes clear to everyone that space is integral to our mission."

Although the association will retain the AFA acronym, which it has used since its inception, it also unveiled a new Star-Delta logo intended to "redefine what those letters stand for," according to an AFA release. The logo merges a modernized blue star on the left, derived from the original "Hap Arnold" Army Air Corps Star, with the Space Force's black Delta and Polaris.

"These elements have been combined to present a unique visual identity that reflects the dynamism and permanent bonds between these two services and their respective warfighting domains," said Murray. "The Polaris in particular is of note, as it represents the Space Force's unique role as a guiding light and enabler for the whole of the joint force."

The rebranding is intended to capture the association's full mission:

- To educate the public about air and space power
- To advocate for the most capable, lethal, and effective Air and Space Forces
- To support Airmen, Guardians, and their families.

"AFA has always been fully committed to supporting both the Air Force and Space Force as the most indispensable elements of our joint force," said AFA President Lt. Gen. Bruce Wright, USAF (Ret.). "Even now, as the Space Force grows, expands, and builds its own, unique warfighting culture, air and space remain

inextricably linked. The Airmen and Guardians who are the masters of those domains nevertheless remain tightly integrated within a single Department of the Air Force. So it is with our Association."
