MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT



Dear Fellow AFA Members and Friends!

I come from the Navy League of the United States where I serve in a national leadership position, visiting Capitol Hill to advocate for Congressional appropriate funding for the sea services. After an AFA position paper came across my desk asking for our support, I realized that as an Air Force retiree, I was missing the boat (pun intended) by not bringing that enthusiasm for advocacy and desire to help to my home service. Since joining AFA and our local Lance P. Sijan chapter just over a month ago, I've had the privilege to attend multiple events and speak at the recent Industry Military Annual Golf Event (IMAGE) where AFA is an annual sponsor. The golfers are always very generous, helping raise more than \$10,000 annually for local youth science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) scholarships and programs. I also attended a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the brand new AFROTC Detachment at UCCS where the flags displayed were purchased using funds donated by your Lance P. Sijan chapter! The Lance P. Sijan Chapter #125 recently supported the establishment of AFROTC Detachment 105A at the University of Colorado—Colorado Springs (UCCS) with a \$3,500 donation. The donation covered the cost of the flags shown for the detachment, to be used for display and ceremonies.

Detachment 105A is a new operating location of Detachment 105 at the University of Colorado—Boulder. Its standup eliminates the requirement for a three-hour drive weekly from Colorado Springs to Boulder for the UCCS cadets. Celebrating 80 Years of Air & Space Impact with the Best of the Best

The hosting Lance P. Sijan Chapter in Colorado gave very specific directions for how the annual Air & Space Forces Association (AFA) Colorado State Awards Banquet on August 15, 2026, was to be conducted. “This is not intended to be a quiet event! Please cheer loudly for your nominees!” And that’s exactly what happened.

Following a lively cocktail hour with light jazz music provided by The Todd Williams Trio, the awards event was opened by Master of Ceremonies, Mr. Dave Geuting. He introduced the top three nominees in each military and civilian category as they entered the banquet hall to the sound of 150 attendees cheering and pounding on the tables. The widely attended event brought together corporate sponsors with senior military leadership, all for the purpose of recognizing the Active Duty, Guard and Reserve Airmen, Jr. Guardians, Cadets and Civilians in Colorado units that continue to make our Air & Space Forces the greatest in the world!

Senior military and Community leaders were first able to meet the future of the Air and Space Forces as AFROTC cadets from University of Colorado-Boulder greeted them at the check-in table, performed the National Anthem and honored the POW/MIA table. Those same cadets were able to meet and inspire the AF JROTC cadets from Mitchell High School who participated as the Honor Guard for the event. The Colorado Springs Mayor’s Office offered welcoming remarks and the Doubletree Hotel in Colorado Springs provided a scrumptious Italian buffet leading up to the sage advice and lessons learned shared by 30-year soon-to-be retired Chief Master Sergeant Gerald Morey, Senior Enlisted Airmen for Space Base Delta 41.

For weeks prior to the event, an awards committee comprised of members from all Colorado AFA Chapters spent hours pondering large stacks of nominations from Peterson, Schriever and Buckley Space Force Bases, AFROTC Detachment and the Air Force Academy. They painstakingly narrowed the list down to the top three Best of the Best nominees in 12 categories ranging from Airman and Guardians to Cadets and Civilians Categories I and II. Their decisions led to the highlight of the evening – recognition of the top nominees and announcement of the winners in each category. All military and government civilians were presented with certificates and state coins for their top nomination, and the winner in each category received a beautifully carved wooden coin tray inscribed with their name and the title of the award.



In addition, all four Colorado AFA Chapter Teachers of the Year were recognized at the event. They each received a Medal of Honor quotes book personally autographed by Medal of Honor recipient, Drew Dix. Colorado AFA also has a legacy scholarship which was presented to Miss Emilee Hund, an exceptional student nominated by the Mel Harmon Chapter of Pueblo, CO. And we didn't forget to honor our many AFA volunteers for their hours of service and dedication to advocating, educating and supporting our Air & Space Forces personnel and their families.



The evening culminated with the announcement of the Colorado AFA Member of the Year, Mr. Dave Geuting from the Lance P. Sijan Chapter. Dave has been an extraordinary influence in re-establishing connections with leadership of the nearby Space Force Bases, USAFA and with current and potential Community Partners. He has sparked a revitalized interest in AFA from local civic leaders and has been key to re-energizing the Lance P. Sijan Chapter.
